Art assignments for the week of 4/13/20-4/17/20

K p. 36 Read the directions. As a follow up to creating a collage of a face using whatever materials you have around, create a full figure self-portrait. Just like last week think about what would make it interesting and show something about you.

1st p. 17-18 Read the directions. Create a drawing of a playground you would enjoy. The directions ask you to make a collage, if you have the materials feel free to make a collage, if not, a drawing is fine. Have fun with it!

2nd p. 19-20 Read the directions. Following up on last weeks warm and cool color landscapes, create a landscape that gives the idea of calm. What kinds of things should you include?

3rd p. 14 Read the directions. Following up on last week's project of drawing a figure, this week think about space. Things that are closer are bigger, things far away are small. Draw at least two figures showing close and far. Pick whatever setting is interesting to you.

4th p. 17-18 Read the directions. Create a cityscape with different sized buildings, make sure to overlap. The directions are for a tissue paper collage, but I want you to make it a drawing. Carefully consider what details you should include, look at pictures of cityscapes for ideas and inspiration.

5th p. 12 Read the directions. This week is the figure in correct proportion. Draw a figure doing most anything in correct proportion. Have someone pose for you if you can, or feel free to draw from a book or magazine, but make sure your proportions are correct.
